About the Sponsor

The Sponsor is a commercial-stage biopharmaceutical company focused on the development and commercialization of oncology medicines. With several pivotal-stage products in its pipeline, the Sponsor aims to become a world leader in developing important new medicines to address significant unmet clinical needs.

The Challenge

The Sponsor recently received FDA-approval for its lead pipeline product for the treatment of solid tumors in infants. Following this initial approval, the Sponsor wanted to provide early access to the medicine for patients in Europe, through a Post-Approval Named Patient Program (PA-NPP).

Why Do Sponsors Provide PA-NPPs?

Through a PA-NPP, a Sponsor can supply approved medicines to patients in countries where they are not yet approved or commercially available, in order to:



Manage unsolicited patient requests for the medicine



Provide physicians early experience using the medicine

Develop an expert KOL network and advocates for medicine



Generate additional revenue stream from PA-NPP sales

The treatment that the Sponsor wanted to provide to patients through the PA-NPP is a specialized product with a very complex administration process. Because of this, the Sponsor team was aware that many HCPs at the treating sites would need additional support when providing treatment to patients.
